

Q1 Have you noticed any of the following changes in the environment or community? (you can choose more than one)





Q2 How concerned are you about how climate change can affect animals and plants, like orcas, salmon, and huckleberries?





Q3 Which of the following energy sources do you think will be MOST important in the next 10 years?











Q6 Have you been impact by a natural or human-made hazard in your community?





Q7 Do you have flood insurance?





Q8 Have you taken actions to protect your home and/or business from the impacts of hazards?





Q9 Do you have project ideas for how to protect the Tribe from the impacts of hazards?





Q11 Of the following, what do you think are the best platforms to learn more about climate change/hazard impacts on the Tulalip Tribes? (You may choose more than one)




