PLANNING for SUCCESS

Attending college is a big decision. There are many factors to consider and choices to be made. Planning for success takes time. You should ask several questions when developing your plan. The **Educational Resources Handbook** is designed to help you find those answers.

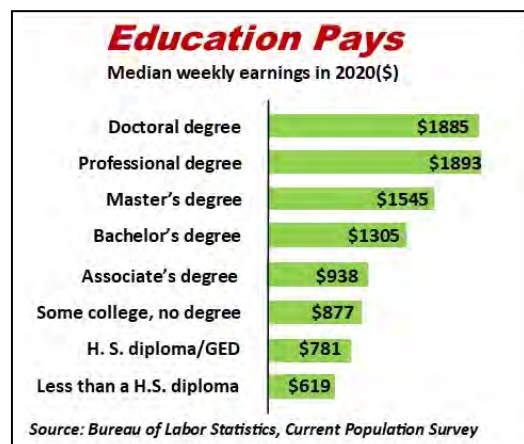
- Why is attending college or a post-secondary course of study worth the effort?
- Which type of school is right for you?
- What do you want to study?
- Where do I find out about funding for school?
- What is financial aid?
- What types of financial aid are available to you as a Tulalip Tribal member?
- What other resources are available in planning for your post-secondary education?



I. Education Pays

Students often ask, “Is it worth attending college or taking post-secondary courses of study?” In response, consider the following points:

- Studies prove, time and again, that college-educated workers earn more than workers with only a high school diploma. College graduates often enjoy additional benefits, including greater job opportunities and promotions. Based on lifetime earnings, a person who graduates from college earns 66% more than those who have only a high school diploma/GED.
- The U.S. Bureau of Statistics projects that the fastest growing jobs will be those requiring high levels of education and skill.
- A person who attends college or a trade school develops a particular skill or talent, and their ability to think critically and analytically improves.
- An education provides a greater sense of accomplishment, enhances self-esteem, and contributes to personal self-fulfillment.
- College provides an expanded understanding of the world and its people and enhances a person's character.



Note: Data are for persons age 25 and over. Earnings are for full-time wage and salary workers.

The United States Department of Labor provides additional facts and figures in the **Occupational Outlook Handbook**. The Handbook provides information about different jobs, required training and education, earnings, expected job prospects, job description and working conditions. The Handbook also provides job search tips, links to information about the job market in each State, and more. Visit their website at www.bls.gov/ooh/. II. Choosing the Right School

There are several factors to consider when choosing the right school to attend. Choosing the “**RIGHT**” school might be the most important decision in the planning process. We recommend that you consider talking with people whose opinion you respect during this process.

The National Center for Educational Statistics is a great tool for locating and comparing schools online at <http://www.nces.ed.gov/ipeds/cool>. The center provides various statistics for students to utilize in determining which school to go to and the steps you should consider prior to attending college. Students can build a list of schools with side-by-side comparisons. Included are tips on preparing for post-secondary education, and how to prepare for education beyond high school.

Types of Post-Secondary Institutions

Post-secondary educational institutions may be classified in the following ways:

PUBLIC INSTITUTIONS

Public schools and colleges are funded primarily by state and or local governments. This means that state or local government is subsidizing (assisting with the cost) the school and your tuition is considerably less.

PRIVATE INSTITUTIONS

Private institutions are privately funded by organizations, individual bequests, and student fees. Generally, tuition is higher at a private school or college than at a public institution.

PUBLIC COMMUNITY COLLEGE

Public community colleges typically offer certificates and two-year degree programs, and are also known as junior colleges. Some offer “terminal” programs that train for special skills, i.e. dental technology, office occupations, computer technology, practical nursing, cosmetology or diesel mechanics. They may also offer “transfer” programs for those students who want to go on to a four-year degree college or university.

STATE COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES

Every state has its own four-year institutions, many of which offer advanced training in the arts, humanities, business, health, sciences and law. The schools range widely in size and type of programs offered. The school usually offers two-year, four-year and graduate degree programs. Consult the school’s catalogue for more details. The state, tuition, fees, and donors fund these schools.

TRIBAL COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES

Tribal colleges and universities provide access to post-secondary education, accredited degrees, and vocational training for both Indian and non-Indian students. Most are located on or near Indian reservations. Culture and tradition are part of the curricula. For a list of Tribal Colleges, [see pages 58-59](#).

PRIVATE JUNIOR COLLEGES

Funded by private, tuition and fees. These schools have limited application acceptance. Programs are usually two-year “transfer” type programs.

VOCATIONAL TRAINING INSTITUTIONS

Privately owned or state run training institutions that offer post-secondary training at varying levels which may offer certificates or degrees. Credits may or may not be transferable. These schools may be funded by the state and scholarship donors.

PRIVATE, FOR-PROFIT COLLEGES/UNIVERSITIES

Privately owned and offers limited selection of certificate and two-year degree programs. Students enrolled in for-profit colleges who transfer to non-profit colleges should make sure that their credits will transfer from one school to another.

ONLINE PROGRAMS

Online programs are often structured as self-paced courses and may allow working students to complete coursework on a more convenient schedule. Online programs may open educational access to individuals living in remote areas that lack access to traditional brick-and-mortar schools. They may be available through traditional non-profit colleges and universities as well as for-profit institutions.



School Selection Criteria

Evaluate which school or schools may be suitable for your educational goals by considering the following:

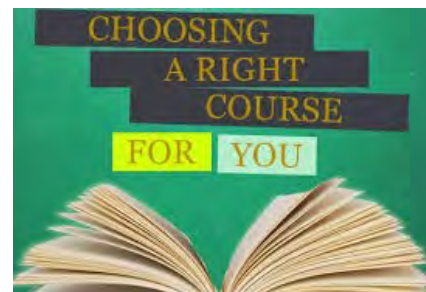
- What is the total cost of tuition, supplies, other required fees and books?
- Does the school offer the academic program or classes that will (a) prepare you for a career and (b) satisfy your learning interests? Does the school provide adequate student support services—academic counseling, tutoring, close teacher-student interaction, work experience, extra-curricular activities (sports, drama, music, art, clubs and support services that appeal to Native Americans, etc.)?
- Is the size of the school (and class size) suitable for your preferences?
- Are the courses of high quality? Will they adequately prepare you for the field? Will the credits transfer to other institutions? Is the curriculum up-to-date?
- Is the location of the school satisfactory?
- What is the school's graduation rate? What is the school's dropout rate?
- What measures are taken to ensure the safety of students?
- Are campus housing and meal plans available? What is the cost?
- What is the school's atmosphere regarding a diverse student body?
- To what extent does the school offer student financial aid?
- Does the school have a placement service for its graduating students? If so, how does it assist the student in finding employment?
- Is the institution accredited by an accrediting agency recognized by the U. S. Board of Education?
- Is the school authorized to operate? The authorizing agency in Washington is the State of Washington Higher Education Coordinating Board (<http://www.wsac.wa.gov/sites/default/files/JulMtg01.pdf>). They administer the regulations implementing the Educational Services Registration Act for all degree-granting institutions. Private vocational schools are registered by the Workforce Training and Education Coordinating Board (<http://www.wtb.wa.gov>).



III. Choosing the Right Course of Study

Students enrolling in a post-secondary education program have to make important decisions regarding their ultimate educational and career goals. There are a number of degree program options to consider when thinking about your future career and your personal commitment to your own education. When making a decision to pursue a specific degree, you should consider your own unique situation, assess your personal level of interest, determine available funding for your education and the time required to complete the coursework. Your future career goals may also give you direction to what degree(s) you should pursue.

- Career Diploma/Certificate: In general, 2-9 months to complete
- Vocational Training Program: Approximately 2-18 months to complete
- Associate Degree: 2-year degree program
- Bachelor Degree: 4-year degree program
- Master's Degree: 1-3 year degree program after earning a Bachelor's degree
- Doctorate Degree: 7-9 year degree program after earning a Bachelor's degree
- Professional Degree (medicine, law, optometry, etc.): 3-4 years after earning a Bachelor's degree (depending on the degree)



IV. College Bound

For Prospective students, the following steps will provide an idea of the time and steps required to plan for attending college.

The important and consistent fact is that it takes **TIME** to prepare to enroll in a degree program in college, in occupational training, or in selected courses of study. On the next page is an example of a planning cycle for anyone who wants to make the most of the opportunities in preparation for attending college.



NOTE: Keep an eye out for college preparation and scholarship programs that are offered based on participation in junior high and high school programs. Review *High School Education and Scholarship Programs* in this handbook.

College Bound **TIMELINE**

JUNIOR YEAR - Prepare.....

- Consider doing volunteer work or getting a job. If you are a high school student, consider taking summer school classes to boost your GPA or get ahead in your studies.
- Obtain leadership experience by joining clubs or taking part in school activities.
- Consider taking a course to prepare for the SAT or ACT.
- Get test schedules for SAT and ACT. Note deadlines and dates. Register for the spring SAT or ACT.
- Review your grade transcripts with a guidance counselor to see how selective your college choices may be. Make sure you are on track to graduate and fulfill admission requirements for schools you are applying to.
- Research deadlines for scholarships, grants, admissions applications and financial aid. Create a calendar to make sure you apply on time.
- Make campus visits and interview the faculty, admissions staff and students, if possible.
- Request college applications from the schools you are interested in or look online.

ALL YEAR

- Work hard all year, second semester grades can affect eligibility and admission decisions.
- Earn college credits in high school through Advanced Placement (AP), International Baccalaureate (IB), Running Start, College in the High School and/or Tech Prep.

SENIOR YEAR - FALL QUARTER - Explore, get ready, submit!

- Attend college fairs and information nights. By **October 15th**, narrow down your list of schools to 3-5 schools and start working on applications!
- Complete and submit all your college applications by December 15th. (Keep copies for your files.)
- Complete/submit early decision and early action applications. (Keep copies for your files.)
- Submit major financial aid applications. (Keep copies for your files.)
- If you have not already done so, create a seeker profile on **www.thewashboard.org**. This will help you with your scholarship search and application process during your senior year.
- Get an estimate of your eligibility for federal student aid by using FAFSA4Caster at: https://fafsa.ed.gov/spa/fafsa4c/?locale=en_US#/landing.
- Using FAFSA4Caster before your senior year will shorten the time it takes you to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) application.

WINTER QUARTER - Focus on money, money, money...

- The **Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)** application is now available for students beginning **October 1st** of each year. Those submitting a FAFSA for the 2022-23 school year will use tax information from 2020 for the application. Awards are made until funds are depleted. Funding is on a first-come, first-serve basis. APPLY EARLY!
- Switch your focus to scholarships (now that FAFSA and college applications have been submitted). Apply to appropriate scholarships. www.thewashboard.org has over to 3,000 scholarships available to students.
- Keep your grades up!

SPRING QUARTER - Finalize decisions!

- Visit schools that you have been admitted to and take advantage of any campus tours that are available.
- Make your college decision by **May 1st** and send in the tuition deposit to the school you will attend.
- Find out about tuition waivers.
- Attend freshmen orientation camp/sessions.

FALL QUARTER - Begin College classes.



V. Financial Aid

Financial Aid is financial assistance intended to aid students in reaching their educational goals. This assistance may come in a variety of forms such as grants, scholarships, work-study, and loan programs.

Types of Financial Aid

Financial aid is defined as scholarships, grants, loans and work-study that provides funding for a student to attend college or obtain technical skills training. There are six (6) types of financial aid a student may be eligible to apply for.



GRANTS

Student grants are free monetary gifts for students who are pursuing higher education. Unlike student loans, grants do not require repayment. Read more: <https://studentaid.ed.gov/sa/types/grants-scholarships>

SCHOLARSHIPS

A scholarship is a monetary award for a student to further his or her education. Scholarships are awarded based upon various criteria, which usually reflect the values and purposes of the donor or founder of the award. Scholarship money does not require repayment.

TUITION WAIVERS

A tuition waiver is a program initiated by states that allows students to attend publicly funded institutions of higher learning by "waiving" tuition and fees under certain criteria. The process to access these funds and eligibility requirements vary significantly from state to state. WORK-STUDY PROGRAMS

A work-study program enables high-school or college students to combine academic work with actual job experience, i.e. Federal Work-Study Program.



SPECIAL DISCOUNTS

Schools may offer special discounts based on criteria determined by the school.

LOANS

Money borrowed to finance education or school related expenses. Payments are often deferred while in school and for a six-month grace period after graduation. Sallie Mae is the largest source of education loans and handles the two major types, the Stafford loan and the Perkins loan. One major benefit of this type of loan is that they come with low interest rates and do not require any collateral or credit check.

VI. Higher Education Financial Plan

The following is information students will need to know when calculating the cost of attending college.

- **COST OF ATTENDANCE**
Includes tuition, required fees, books, supplies, on-campus or off-campus housing, on campus and off-campus meal plans.
- **EXPECTED FAMILY CONTRIBUTION**
The amount of funds the student will have to pay for the cost of attending the school including student's personal contribution and parents contribution.
- **FINANCIAL NEED**
The difference between the Cost of Attending School and the Expected Family Contribution.

Cost of Attendance

The cost to attend college or other post-secondary education schools is made up of several expenses for which student financial aid may be available. They include the following:

- **Direct Education Costs:** Tuition, registration, other fees, parking, lab requirements, books and supplies.
- **Indirect Education Costs:** Rent, meals, personal expenses, transportation, cell phone, internet services, etc.
- **Special Costs:** Child care and ongoing medical expenses.



Financial Need

Suggested procedure to aid students in preparing a financial plan for college.

1. Determine where you will attend college.
2. Determine the cost of attendance for the college.
3. Determine the total funding resources available from you and your parents.
4. Identify funding resource opportunities to offset your financial need.
5. Obtain and complete applications for **FAFSA**, scholarships and grants. Consider applying for work-study. Then, and **ONLY IF ABSOLUTELY NECESSARY**, consider applying for a student loan from federal or state programs (lower interest rates). A last resort option would be private lenders such as credit unions, savings and loans or banks. However, with private lenders, you would incur much higher interest rates.
6. Keep a copy of all your applications for your files and send the completed application for processing by the funding agency or organization.
7. Contact the funding source/s about the status of your application/s.
8. Report the outcome of your financial aid to the school through the financial aid office in order to keep your education expense account current. Keep track of all the funding assistance you receive.
9. Consider vacation-time employment or other temporary work to build up personal earnings/savings for the next school term.
10. Keep personal records of your financial aid awards. The 1986 Federal Income Tax Law categorizes the amount of scholarship awards used for the cost of room and meals as taxable income which must be reported by the student on his/her income tax forms filed with the Internal Revenue Service (IRS). Visit www.irs.gov for more information.
11. Investigate education tax credits for which you may qualify for on your annual IRS income tax form.



Formula for Financial Need

Stated as a formula, Financial "Need" is calculated as: **Cost of Attendance - Expected Family Contribution = "Financial Need"**. The Financial need must be solved by identifying additional resources from grants, scholarships, work-study and loan programs to pay for the cost of attending college. Students may want to use the Education Budget Forecast below to calculate their educational cost of attendance, expected family contribution and financial need.

7. Native organizations and foundations such as Tulalip Tribes Higher ED Department and other tribal governments.
8. The AmeriCorps program provides full-time educational awards in return for work in community service.

10. Companies and labor unions that have scholarship programs for their employees, family members, or other students with financial need.
11. Other foundations, religious organizations, fraternities or sororities, and clubs such as the YMCA, American Legion, Fraternal Order of Eagles, 4-H, Kiwanis, Jaycees, Chamber of Commerce, churches, etc.
12. Organizations in your career field. Examples: American Bar Association (law), American Medical Association (health), National Educators Association.

We are able to gauge our success of this program by the number of students who graduate annually. It is gratifying to be able to assist our students as they become productive members of society.

Stan Jones, Sr., in the April 2007 issue of Indian Gaming magazine, said this about education, "The fuel for any thriving economy is education. Education creates new jobs and often proves to be the antidote to long-term economic obstacles. Over the past few years, the economic growth of the Tulalip Tribes has been remarkable but it is the tribe's educational efforts that have fueled the fire.

Many of our tribal elders sought their early education on the shores of Tulalip Bay, gill nets and fishing poles in hand. Ultimately, their educators were time and hard work. Today, the Tulalip Tribes can give our youth a formal education, so that they can become the next generation of Leaders."

XIII. Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)



Federal Student Aid Programs

Financial Aid packages likely include funds from federal student aid programs such as: Federal Pell Grants, U.S. Department of Education Direct Loans, Campus-Based Programs, Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunities, Grants, Federal Work Study, and the Perkins Loans. These programs are administered by the U.S. Department of

Education for students attending post-secondary schools. Important Note: *Not all schools participate in all federal student aid programs.* Check with the school's financial aid office to make sure the school participates in the federal program (s) when applying for federal aid.

Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) (800) 433-3243

To apply for financial aid from federal-based education grant programs, students must complete an application form called the **Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)**. A student may apply online at the U.S. Department of Education website. Students can obtain a FAFSA application form from their school or from the Federal Student Aid Information Center. The FAFSA application is also used to determine a student's eligibility for federal student grants, work-study aid, and loans. The application is also used to determine eligibility for most state and some private aid.

What documents do I need to fill out a FAFSA?

You will need records of income earned in the year prior to when you will start school. **You will also need records of your parents' income information if you are a dependent student.**

For EACH school year you will need financial information from the prior year. You may need to refer to:

- Your Social Security card. It is important that you enter your Social Security number correctly!
- Your driver's license (if any)
- Your prior year's W-2 forms and other records of money earned
- Your (if married, your spouse's) prior year Federal Income Tax Return
- IRS 1040, 1040A, 1040 EZ
- Foreign Tax Return, or Tax Return for Puerto Rico, Guam, American Samoa, U.S. Virgin Islands, Marshall Islands, Federal States of Micronesia, or Palau
- Your Parent's prior year Federal Income Tax Return (if you are a dependent student)
- Your prior year untaxed income records
- Your current bank statements
- Your current business and investment mortgage information, business and farm records, stocks, bonds, and other investment records
- Your alien registration or permanent resident card (if you are not a U.S. citizen)



To organize your information, you can print and complete a *FAFSA on the Web* Worksheet before you begin.

1. Apply for Pin #
2. Fill out and sign FAFSA Application and submit it.
3. 3-5 days after you submit your application, go to **www.fafsa.ed.gov** to access your Student Aid Report.
4. Keep a copy for yourself and email a copy to Tulalip Tribes Higher Education.

How to View Your Student Aid Report

Instructions:

- 1** Visit the FAFSA website. From the homepage, select "FAFSA Follow Up." From that screen, click on "Check Status of a submitted FAFSA Application." When prompted, enter your Social Security number, first and last name and the year you submitted your application. The FAFSA website will ask you to enter the PIN number that was mailed to you. Enter the PIN number.
- 2** Select "Transaction Number" and pick the FAFSA application you would like to view.
Select the PDF version to print.
- 3** View information on your report by highlighting and clicking on "SAR Comments." Alternatively, you can select "Print Summary" on the left pane to have a complete, comprehensive view of your SAR. If you did not qualify for any student funding, the SAR will note any relevant reasons. The report will also show ways you can qualify for additional funding. If there are any discrepancies or errors on your SAR, select "Print | Summary" and bring a copy of your SAR to your guidance counselor.

Once you are done checking your SAR, log out.

XIV. Washington State & School Financial Aid

State/School Programs

The school's financial aid office is the best place to begin searching for free scholarships and grants. The financial aid administrator can provide information about the student aid available from the state, the school itself, and other sources. The school is required to provide information about their financial aid procedures and deadlines, plus how and when awards are disbursed by the school. Be sure to read and understand the school's and the financial aid provider's satisfactory academic progress policy. Keep copies of the enrollment agreement, the school's catalog, and all financial aid documents (especially loan documents) received.

Free information about federal, state, school and private student aid is available at your local library's reference section (usually listed under "student aid" or "financial aid"). Student aid information may also be available from foundations, religious organizations, community organizations, and civic groups, as well as organizations related to the educational or professional field of interest, such as the American Medical Association or American Bar Association.

There are two (2) education tax credits available, the Hope Credit and the American Opportunity Credit. The credits are based on education expenses paid for the student, student's spouse, or dependents. During any particular year, students can only claim one (1) of the credits.

XV. How to Apply for Financial Aid

Determining your eligibility for need-based aid

Your financial need is the difference between the amount it will cost you to go to school (cost of attendance) and the amount of money that you and your family are judged able to pay (expected family contribution).

Your **expected family contribution** will not vary much from school to school. However, each school has a different **cost of attendance**. Therefore, your financial need, or the amount of aid for which you qualify, may vary from school to school.

To determine your expected family contribution and your financial need, colleges and universities use the **Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)**. The FAFSA considers your family income and assets, family size, and number of family members in college.

The calculation, which determines eligibility for aid, is complicated. There is no income cutoff. **The only way to find out if you are eligible for any financial aid is to apply.**

The application process is not difficult and help is available throughout the process. If you have questions about the FAFSA, contact your college or university financial aid office, or call toll-free **1-800-433-3243**.

AVOID SCHOLARSHIP SCAMS

Beware of any service that wants you to pay for a scholarship search. Most scholarships are listed online or at your local Library for **FREE**.

How to Apply

- 1. Complete the FAFSA** - To apply for federal financial aid and most state aid programs, you must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). The FAFSA is available online at www.fafsa.ed.gov. **Apply as soon as possible beginning OCTOBER 1, for the upcoming academic year.** Do not wait until you are admitted to a college to apply.
- 2. Review your Student Aid Report** - One week after you submit your FAFSA, you will receive a Student Aid Report (SAR). Review it carefully for accuracy and make corrections, if necessary.
- 3. Contact prospective colleges and universities** - Contact the financial aid offices of prospective schools as soon as possible about application procedures and deadlines. Ask about financial aid opportunities, including tuition waivers and scholarships.
- 4. Follow instructions and meet all deadlines** - If your FAFSA or other financial aid applications are late or incomplete, you may not receive all the aid you are eligible for. Financial aid is given to eligible students on a **first come, first served basis** - schools can and do run out of some types of aid.
- 5. Research scholarships** - Check to see if local organizations or your employer (or parent's employer) offer scholarships. Visit free scholarship search services on the internet. For more information, visit the Washington State Scholarship pages at <http://www.wsac.wa.gov/financial-aid>.
- 6. Evaluate financial aid award letters** - Schools will send you award letters with details of your financial aid package - usually a combination of grants, loans and work study. Compare the financial aid awards carefully. You may be required to either accept or decline your award by a specific date. If you miss this reply deadline, you could lose your financial aid award.
- 7. Keep good records** - Make photocopies of your applications and supporting information. To track important information and dates, you may want to keep a financial aid notebook or worksheet for quick reference.

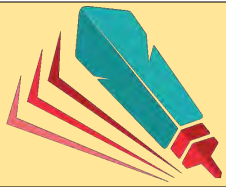

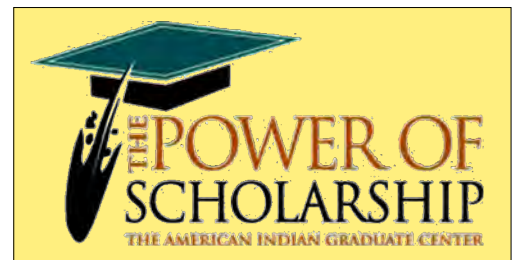

Undergraduate vs. Graduate Study: Our Perspective

Most baccalaureate (**undergraduate**) degrees generally prepare you for life and the professional workforce. The academic skills you've acquired throughout your high school years are honed and tweaked to ensure that you are a broadly educated, socially aware, critically thinking, contributor to society. You're taught to reason, justify and support your decisions. Through your major you can elect to develop a specialized professional skill set that will give you the fundamental preliminary skills needed to embark upon the career of your choice.

Graduate School on the other hand is all about the mastery of skills and the sustenance of that knowledge. In graduate school you build upon your existing skills and understanding and are trained to be an authority in your field. In college, you learn how to do your job but in graduate school you learn about your job/profession through the context of its history, roles, functions, and broader implications & impacts. You learn the conditions necessary for success in a leadership position and you learn how to assess and ensure those conditions as things change and evolve in the world.

XVII. Nuts & Bolts of Graduate School

Tips in Considering Grad School . . .

So you are thinking about taking the plunge and going back to grad school? I've heard that some of the worst decisions have been made by just assuming that the top reasons for attending a school are the rankings and word-of-mouth reputations. It is probably better to take the time and do the research so that you can make the most informed decision. There are a number of factors you should consider in finding both the program and the best school for you.

1. **Allow enough time:** Waiting until the last few weeks before the application deadline is way too late. You should allow yourself at least six (6) months to review websites, gather information and contact key persons you believe will help you clarify your grad school options/direction as well as write a good recommendation. Take the time to check out the campuses to compare and contrast.
2. **Learn about the industry you want to work in:** It is really important to learn as much as you can about what exactly the professionals in your field actually do every day. If you haven't considered the professional realities of your chosen field or even know if you would like the daily work, this would be a good time to see if this is actually what you would like to do for the rest of your life. Graduate school is where you really delve into your field. Interview people who work in this area. Internships are very helpful. If you know anyone who is doing the job, see if they would make the same choice again.
3. **Keep your options open:** Start out with a large number of school options. Take the time to check them all out. Start by doing an internet search with broad keywords like "graduate programs in business, law, medicine, education, arts, sciences or whatever your interest is. Start reading about the schools that offer Masters and PhD programs in your area. As you research, your list will automatically whittle it's way down to the schools and programs that are a "good fit for you".
4. **Create a spreadsheet:** Make a "compare and contrast" spreadsheet. Put your list of grad school options on the left hand column. Across the top put the things that are most important to you in considering what schools would be best for you, i.e., location, financial aid, cost, amenities, etc. This will take a little time but it will be worth it. You will most likely discover programs and schools that have a lot more going for them. On the other hand your top schools might lose some of their shine.
5. **Test the admissions office:** Choose an important question for which you need a good answer and cannot find it on the website. (i.e. "What types of career services the school offers to students?"). Send an email to the admissions office. Add two columns to the spread sheet to compare answers to questions: How long does it take for a reply? Was my question answered and in a friendly manner? This will be a good indication how you will be treated after you are enrolled in the program.
6. **Visit the campus:** Campus visits will let you know how it feels to be on campus. Will the physical and cultural environment be comfortable to you? Will the facilities be up to date? Will you feel at home?
7. **Talk to current students & alumni:** By taking the time to talk to past and current students you will be in a much better position to make an informed decision about where you want to apply for grad school. This will give you more confidence about your decision and you will have a richer student experience.



Financial Aid for Graduate Students

There are several types of financial aid for graduate students. If you are eligible, you can receive more than one (1) type of aid.

Most students get a combination of grants and loans. Some students may receive scholarships in addition to grants and loans. There are multiple sources of funding for graduate students. Graduate students generally finance their education through fellowships and assistantships in addition to grants and loans.

Grants: Grants are gifts that you do not need to repay. There are several different types of grants available to students. Students may receive grants from the government or through private sources of funding. Usually government grants are given to students with need, such as a low household income. Government grants do require students to maintain a specific (GPA) grade point average throughout their academic career to continue to receive aid. Private grants usually come in the form of scholarships and have their own guidelines. The amount being offered varies for each individual based on different criteria. In graduate school, grants can be used towards travel, research, experiments or projects in addition to funding tuition, books and living expenses.



Scholarships: Scholarships are awards given to students based on academic excellence and/or talent. Also, students may receive scholarships based on other criteria such as ethnic background, field of study or financial need.

Scholarships vary in their amounts and the number of years given aid. They can be awarded as a one-time payment or aid can be received annually for a certain number of years, i.e. \$1000 scholarship or \$5000 per year for four years. Like a grant, scholarships do not need to be paid back.

Scholarships can be awarded through the school or through private sources. Institutions offer various scholarships based on merit, talent, and/or need. Contact your school - for a list of scholarships offered to students. Private scholarships are offered through organizations or companies. Some organizations make students compete for awards through performance or essay writing while some look for students that best fit specific requirements and standards. You can search for private scholarships on the internet through online scholarship search engines, i.e. Fastweb, scholarship books or by contacting the school.



Fellowships: Fellowships are granted to graduate and post-grad students. They are like scholarships and do not require repayment. Fellowships are awarded by private organizations, institutions and the government. Fellowships vary in the amount being awarded and can be used towards research or education. Students can be given a 1 to 4 year stipend with or without a tuition waiver. The type of fellowship awarded is based on merit, need and the institution's/faculty's grant. Some schools allow you to directly apply for the fellowships offered through the schools while other schools only award the fellowships to students who have been recommended by a faculty member.

Assistantships: Assistantships are similar to internships or work study awarded during your undergraduate years. Assistantships require students to usually work as teacher assistants (TA), research assistants (RA) to professors or perform other duties on campus. The amount awarded varies based on faculty/institution grants, state or federal aid. Research positions are paid through grants while teaching positions are paid through the institution. The research and teaching positions acquired are in your field of study or department.



Loans: A loan is money that is awarded to a student based on need. Unlike a grant or scholarship, loans must be repaid.

Grad School Application Tips

1. **Know why you are applying:** This may seem obvious but it is worth spending some time thinking about why you are applying to graduate school. This may include your passion for the subject and your desire for more academic challenge. What are your professional and personal goals? What are your academic and professional strengths and weaknesses? What are the positive attributes of the cities and universities you would like to study?

Having a clear and thorough understanding of your reasons for applying to grad school will help you select the most relevant course of study. It will also help you convince admissions officers that you are a perfect candidate for their graduate program.



2. **Start your grad school application as soon as possible:** Meeting application submission deadlines is probably obvious but it does take a considerable amount of time to collect information and complete the requirements for a grad school application. You may need to submit results from grad school exams (GRE, LSAT, MCAT), write a personal statement or application essay and provide official transcripts and references.

Just don't assume that every grad school is the same. Double check each one carefully, making sure you include all specified information but nothing additional. If there is a question, just ask. Universities have a dedicated admissions department that is ready to help.

3. **Check scholarship/funding deadlines:** Scholarship deadlines are often before the application deadlines. Research in this area should be done well in advance. University scholarship program information is usually provided on the institution website. Many also provide suggestions about outside funders. Also scholarships are available through government and non-profit organizations and current or future employers. Check out the **Graduate Scholarships, Fellowships & Internships and Professionals & Postdoctorate Opportunities** sections located on pages 21-44 in this book.
4. **Statement of Purpose:** A graduate Statement of purpose or Personal Statement is an essay that demonstrates your qualifications for and your commitment to your chosen academic field. There is no "right way" to write the essay. Just remember that your audience is composed of experts in the field. You should create a statement of purpose that highlights your strengths and unique qualifications as a student and individual. You want to establish your voice and be confident and straightforward.



The essay should be original and interesting, typically 3-4 pages, typed and double spaced. Try to unite your essay around a theme which is the main point you want to communicate. This will give you direction. Use concrete examples of your life experiences to support your statement of purpose and set you apart from other applicants. Begin your essay with an attention grabbing statement—an anecdote, quote, question or engaging description of a scene. Write about what excites and interests you, this is what the admissions committee wants to hear about you. What are your career objectives going forward? Do you have research interests? End your essay with a conclusion which refers back to the main point and restates your thesis. Revise your essay at least three (3) times. Ask someone else to critique your essay. Proofread your personal statement, making sure it is free of grammar, punctuation and spelling errors.



The end result should be that your reader will be able to determine why you are interested in this field. They will be able to see the growth of interest over a period of time. They will clearly see that graduate school is your next logical step of progression. Include in this discussion if you have had any difficult circumstances and how you have been able to turn these negatives into positives.

XVIII. Internship Opportunities

College Internships: Gateway to Careers

Joining an internship is a great way of mentoring and teaching students or workers new ways of performing within a specific company. The rate of students joining internships has increased in recent years. This is due to companies offering more opportunities within their programs, along with universities acting as the gateway to opportunity. It's important to know the relevance of internships today, and how you as parents can help your student make an internship possible.

What exactly is an internship?

There are many different types of internships but not all jobs qualify as such. They give great learning experiences for students within their specific field. Some of the work performed during an internship is viewed as minor, but it is important for understanding all aspects of the job. Some internships are available during the school year or during the summer. Some people even take part in programs after graduation.

The role of an intern is a mix of employee and student. Internships can either be paid, unpaid or may receive academic credit or none at all. The overall experience is meant to help the student bridge the gap between school and work force. The student and employer work together to help create goals that shape the internship experience. It will help to get both the intern and employer on the same page so to speak.

How can students find internships?

The best way for students to find out about potential internship opportunities is through their college Career Office. The Career Office helps students format cover letters, resumes, interviewing skills, and expectations within the workplace. Other sources of internship inquiries can be found on internship databases online and personal contacts such as family or friends. You can even check out Career Fairs, which are often provided on campus from time to time.

Why are internships so important?

An internship is important because it takes what is learned in the classroom and puts it to practical use. On the other hand, there are many other reasons why your student may want to take part in an internship program during their college experience.

- According to the National Association of Colleges and Employers (NACE), around 50% of employers would like to see an internship on a student's resume.
- An internship can work as a gateway to a job within the company. Again, according to a NACE survey, almost 36% of employers hired employees from their own internship program. According to Matthew Zinman of the Internship Institute, IBM may convert as much as 50% of their interns into full time employees.
- An internship allows a student to "audition" for a job before taking a full on position within the company.
- Students who complete internships may find gaps in their practical knowledge, which may affect which courses they take in the future. They will be able to fill in gaps before they graduate.
- The experience of obtaining the internship may be an experience in its self. The student will have to write a cover letter and resume, complete an application, and interview for the position.
- Your student will gain experience about a particular job or field within the workforce that applies to them.
- An internship looks good on a resume, and employers expect to see one provided on the resume.
- Students may create contacts and have an opportunity to network, which is important to finding a stable job.
- Employers prefer to hire students who have completed internships because it increases job retention. They know that interns have a better understanding of their profession and know what lies ahead within the company.
- Your student can earn academic credit.
- Even if your student finds that they do not enjoy the work within the internship, they will gain valuable experience. They will be able to find a work environment best suited to their work ethic.
- Students who complete internships are more likely to receive higher salaries when they are hired.
- An internship may lead to a job offer.
- Many internships are fun and can be great self-confidence boosters.

As mentioned before, an internship can lead to a job offer. This is not always the case; there are no guarantees when searching for a job. However, students who take part in internship experiences, or multiple internship experiences, have an advantage when searching for a job. Employers are fully aware of the advantages that lie ahead once the internship is complete. It's important to persuade your student to complete an internship at some point before finding a job.

EFFECTIVE STUDY HABITS

You can prepare yourself to succeed in your studies. Try to develop and appreciate the following habits:

- **Take responsibility for yourself** - Recognize that in order to succeed you need to make decisions about your priorities, your time, and your resources.
- **Center yourself around your values and principles** - Don't let friends and acquaintances dictate what you consider important.
- **Put first things first** - Follow up on the priorities you have set for yourself, and don't let others, or other interests, distract you from your goals.
- **Discover your key productivity periods and place** - Morning, afternoon, or evening? Find spaces where you can be the most focused and productive. Prioritize these for your most difficult study challenges.
- **Consider yourself in a win-win situation** - When you contribute your best to a class, you, your fellow students, and even your teacher will benefit. Your grade can then be one additional check on your performance.
- **First understand others, then attempt to be understood** - When you have an issue with an instructor (a questionable grade, an assignment deadline, etc.) put yourself in the instructor's place. Now ask yourself how you can best make your argument given his/her situation.
- **Look for better solutions to problems** - For example, if you don't understand the course material, don't just re-read it. Try something else! Consult with the professor, a tutor, an academic advisor, a classmate, a study group, or your school's study skills center.

PROFESSORS

As college professors have such a large effect on your future and your educational experience, it is important to handle them with respect and dignity.

- If you are struggling in a class, ask questions early in the term. Do not put it off until finals.
- Visit them during office hours. If you have an appointment, view it as a priority.
- Refer to your professor as “Professor” or Doctor” unless otherwise requested.
- Read the syllabus before asking your professor a question.



XXV. Reference Letter Tips & Letter

REFERENCE LETTER TIPS

Almost everyone at some point in time will be asked to provide a **Reference Letter**, whether it's for employment, educational scholarships, or other opportunities that may further your success.

First and foremost, you should be careful in picking the person who will be writing a recommendation letter for you. Remember, not anyone will do. You should pick someone who knows you well and knows your potential to succeed in a particular career field or educational program. Possible reference sources may be your counselor, professor or teacher, supervisor, or colleagues. Family members are not viewed as an impartial reference source and should not be used.

Secondly, you should show upfront how thankful you are that the person is taking time to write a recommendation letter for you.

Thirdly, make sure you make a list of all points that you think should be included in the recommendation letter and give it to the person writing the letter.

Lastly, do not forget to thank the person again for being kind enough to write a scholarship recommendation letter for you.



The following suggestions may be helpful when you find an individual to write a reference letter for you:

- Give the referrer a copy of your resume and or educational description and describe why you need the reference. Your resume should list a stated purpose, work experience, educational history, and other accomplishments. If you know the referrer well, this will help the person write a better letter. The more he/she understands your objective and qualifications, the better reference he/she will be able to provide on your behalf. Make sure you also list points that you think should be included in the recommendation letter.
- Ask the referrer to start the letter by describing how long he/she has known you and in what capacity. Include dates of employment and details about how he/she has worked with or known you.
- If the referrer is a past supervisor or co-worker, he/she should include your skills and performance and what makes/made you a good employee.
- The referrer should end by summarizing why he/she is recommending you for educational funding or a particular job. **IMPORTANT:** The letter should be signed and dated, and include the mailing address and phone number of the referrer on company letterhead. This will provide the potential employer or educational funding office the necessary contact information to follow up if there are questions.

Ensure that the reference letter is sent directly to you or addressed to the educational funding office. When you send out your resume or educational funding application, you should include a copy of each of the letters (s) and carry them with you to job interviews or to the educational funding office.

Send a prompt thank you letter to each of your references when you have completed your job search or received educational funding. It is wise to keep in close contact with your references for two reasons:

1. References can be a great networking tool to track down job leads or places to apply for additional educational funding.
2. You may need their help again down the road.

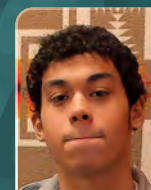
