Public comment invited to review and comment on the 4th Street and 88th Street NE Corridor Improvements Project, May 12 through June 11

TULALIP – The 4th Street and 88th Street NE Corridor Improvements Project website with project information is now ready for public review and comment.

The Tulalip Tribes and Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT), along with Snohomish County, City of Marysville, Community Transit, have been collaborating on access improvements at the I-5/116th St NE Interchange over the past 10 years. With the recent completion of that project, The Tulalip Tribes, along with WSDOT, Snohomish County, City of Marysville, Community Transit, are planning for access improvements to the remaining two interchanges on the I-5 corridor within the boundary of the reservation. These two interchanges are located at 88th Street NE and 4th Street NE/State Route 528/Marine Drive.

This comment period for the 88th Street NE and 4th Street NE/State Route 528/Marine Drive corridor improvements project is the first step of the community engagement process. The Tulalip Tribes will accept comments until 5 p.m. Friday, June 11.

The collaborative effort between The Tulalip Tribes, WSDOT, Snohomish County, City of Marysville, Community Transit, metropolitan and regional planning organizations ensures the project is consistent with local, regional, and state long-range plans.
