Professor Ron Whitener Honored By White House As A ''Champion Of Change''

Professor Ron Whitener, Director of the University of Washington's Native American Law Center and Of Counsel attorney at Foster Pepper PLLC, has been named a "Champion of Change" by the White House. Professor Whitener was honored at an official dinner hosted by Attorney General Eric Holder on October 13, 2011.

Professor Whitener is an enrolled member of the Squaxin Island Tribe.
